

## **Chapter #13: Think the F.B.I. or Federal Courts Will Fix Alaska's Judicial Corruption? Think Again!**

In 2006 Congressman Don Young and Senator Ted Stevens set up meetings in Anchorage between Alaska F.B.I. Section Chief Colton Seale and a small group of citizens who claimed to have evidence of systemic corruption within Alaska's judicial system. This group included long-time attorney Dale Dolifka, former Alaska State Troopers and the evidence: (1) implicated judges, prosecutors, law enforcement, private attorneys, and other officials in unjustly, unconstitutionally, and illegally rigging court proceedings and (2) implicated numerous government agencies in an on-going cover up. (Both Congressman Young and Senator Stevens helped facilitate the meetings with the F.B.I., while Senator Lisa Murkowski refused to do so. It may or may not be significant that the group's evidence implicated Governor Frank Murkowski in corruptly pressuring judges to steer court cases to a conclusion he desired.)

After days of testimony and evidence presentation in August of 2006 (some attended by Greg Kaplan, Congressman Young's assistant at the time), F.B.I. Section Chief Seale stated that Alaska's F.B.I. had ***"received a number of complaints nearly identical"*** to what the group had presented. Mr. Seale then stated ***"in every case our investigation expanded rapidly and implicated nearly everyone. But in every case a call came from D.C. telling us to pull the plug."***

When asked if this call would have come from one of Alaska's three congressional members, Mr. Seale replied, ***"I wouldn't know."*** After this the group never heard back from him.

In 2022 a Kenai Grand Jury investigated systemic judicial corruption in Alaska – and investigated the forgoing meetings and statements by Alaska F.B.I. Section Chief Colton Seale. According to its independent counsel Clint Campion, Mr. Seale was on the 2022 Kenai Grand Jury's list of witnesses to subpoena and question. The Grand Jury also subpoenaed attorney Doifka and other witnesses to the August 2006 F.B.I. meetings. Mr. Campion, in an official court filing, documented that the Kenai Grand Jury then wrote a report and recommendation on what it found.

Unbelievably, however, Alaska's judges sealed the 2022 Kenai Grand Jury's report and recommendation before the public could see them. Even though Mr. Campion confirmed, on tape, that the Grand Jury wrote the report and recommendation for the public and Article 1, Section 8 of Alaska's Constitution states: ***"The power of Grand Juries to investigate and make recommendations concerning the public welfare or safety shall never be suspended."***

Federal courts, up to and including the United States Supreme Court, have all denied review of cases claiming systemic corruption in Alaska's judicial system.

## Conclusion

If the 2022 Kenai Grand Jury got to the bottom, as it appears they may have, of exactly **WHO** stopped multiple F.B.I. investigations into Alaskan judicial corruption that **“expanded rapidly and implicated nearly everyone”**, it is imperative that the Alaska public be informed of what was found. This imperative is re-doubled if the Kenai Grand Jury also found out the exact reason **WHY** the F.B.I. was stopped.
