On consideration of the 9/29/07 motion for over-length brief and motion to waive filing of excerpt, and no opposition having been filed,

IT IS ORDERED:

- 1. The motion to accept over length brief is GRANTED.
- 2. The motion to waive the filing of excerpts is **DENIED**. Appellant's reason for wanting to waive the excerpt seems to be based on a misunderstanding of the excerpt's purpose. The excerpt is not meant to replace the appellate record or to act as a substitute for the record. The court will decide this appeal based on a complete appellate record -- that is, the full record of all proceedings before the fee panel and the superior court. But only one copy of the full appellate record is prepared; it is kept in a central location and is not always immediately available to all of the justices on the court. The purpose of an excerpt is to provide all justices with their own copies of the key documents in the record so that the justices can immediately refer to them as they read the briefs and familiarize themselves with the case.
